



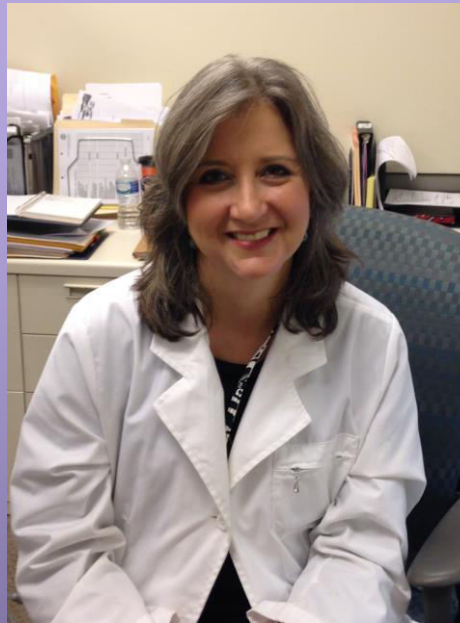
We Care, We Help is a program for patients that need sub-specialty and diagnostic healthcare. The program assists patients with questions such as:

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Early diagnosis and treatment of health conditions provides better outcomes and encourages a healthier community.

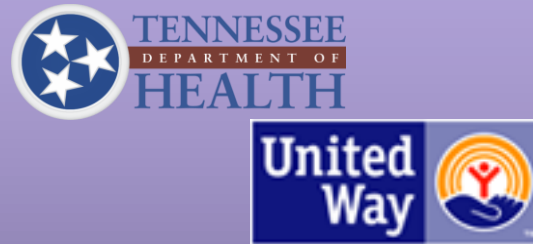
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Many residents in Humphreys cannot afford sub-specialty healthcare.
